The Language Lab, established under the Department of Commerce and Management, was actively used for learning of English language through lessons on Introductions in formal and informal situations, Role Playing, Event Narration, Word Antakshari for Building Vocabulary, Grammar, etc, in this Quarter.



3. Ph.D entrance exam was held on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2016 for total 18 subjects.
4. University Sports board meeting was held on 11<sup>th</sup> August 2016. It was resolved in the meeting to enhance stipend of sport persons, who participated in sport activities, from Rs. 200 to 350. Board unanimously decide to include Yoga as an sports activity. They also resolved to restrict the student to fight election, who taken admission from Sports quota.
5. Under the choice based credit system of University Grants Commission, University started study in IPR as generic elective subject. Department of Commerce and Management will prepare the syllabus for the course.
6. Prof. V. Ramgopal Rao, Director, IIT Delhi and Prof. Ashok Sharma, Hon'ble VC VMOU, Kota along with our Hon'ble VC Prof. P. K. Dashora and Mr. Hira lal ji Nagar, inaugurated a 100-kilowatt capacity solar power plant (generates 400-to-500 units of electricity every day) at the Academic Block of the University. The solar power plant which is located on the roof of the academic block of the University has been set up at a cost of around Rs. 79.49 lakhs including Rs. 24 lakhs from government grants The IIT Delhi Director



stressed on the need of making maximum utilization of solar power in the country. The Vice Chancellor of University of Kota, Professor P. K. Dashora said that the construction of the solar power plant had commenced in December 2015 and was completed this year. He added, "With sunshine available most days in Kota solar power generation is congenial in Kota so University of Kota has established a solar power plant. Solar power is not only eco-friendly but also an economical power generation option. The installation cost of the solar power plant will be recovered in 5 years after which, University of Kota, will get free solar electricity for the next 25 years.

### UOK in News:

1. University opted online admission procedure for the different courses running in the campus. Three new courses started in Mathematic (30 seats, admission fee Rs. 8000 per semester), Botany (20 seats, admission fee Rs. 12000 per semester) and Zoology (20 seats, admission fee Rs. 12000 per semester). Regular classes started from 15<sup>th</sup> July 2016.
2. University also prepared its Fee refund policy for the students, who want to withdraw their admissions.
